**DESCRIPTION**

The PS7801J-1A is a low output capacitance solid state relay containing a GaAs LED on the light emitting side (input side) and MOS FETs on the output side.

An ultra small flat-lead package has been provided which realizes a reduction in mounting area of about 50% compared with the PS72xx series.

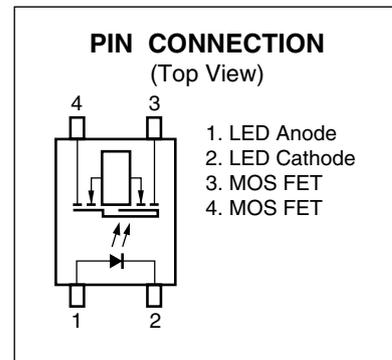
It is suitable for high-frequency signal control, due to its low  $C \times R$  (3 pF  $\cdot \Omega$ ), low output capacitance, and low off-state leakage current.

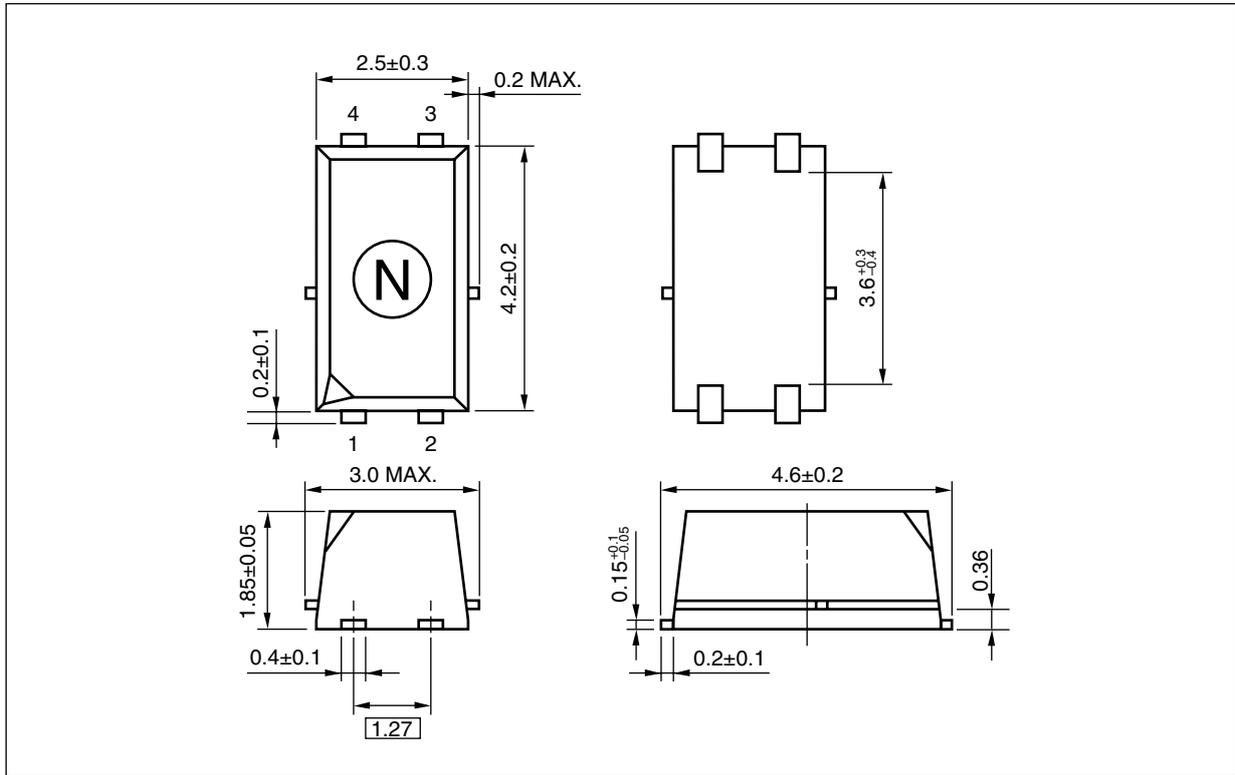

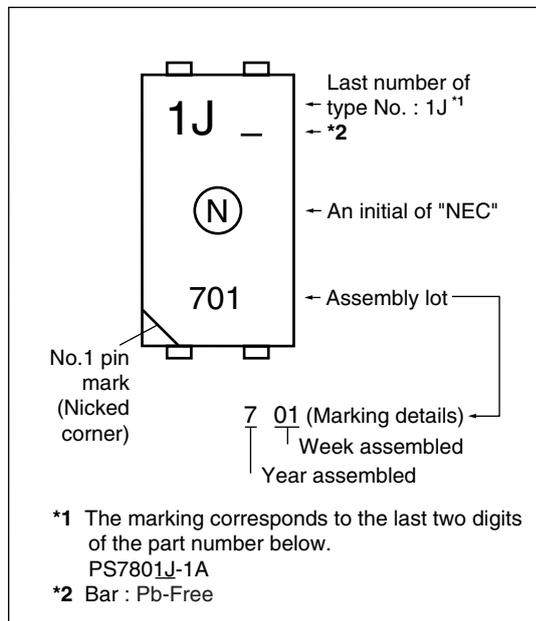


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PACKAGE DIMENSIONS (UNIT: mm)

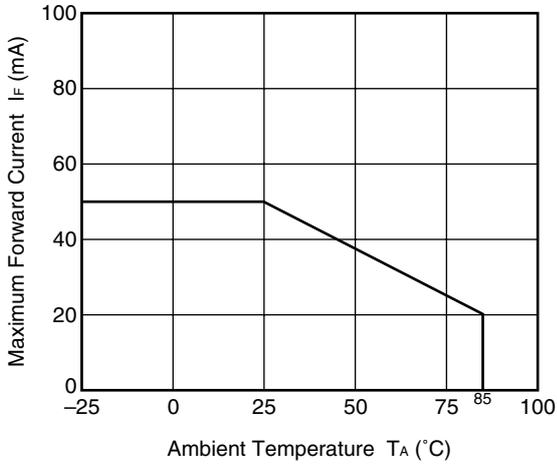

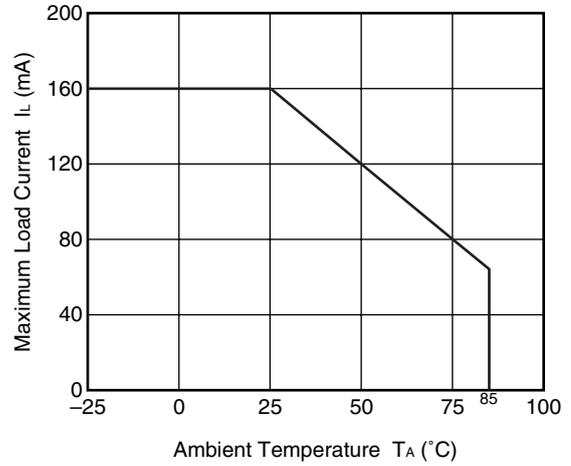

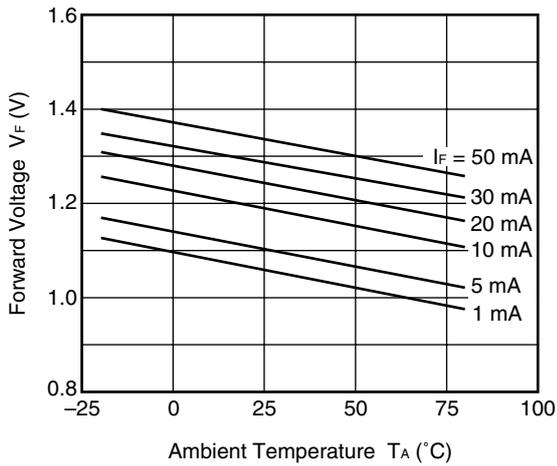
**MAXIMUM FORWARD CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE**



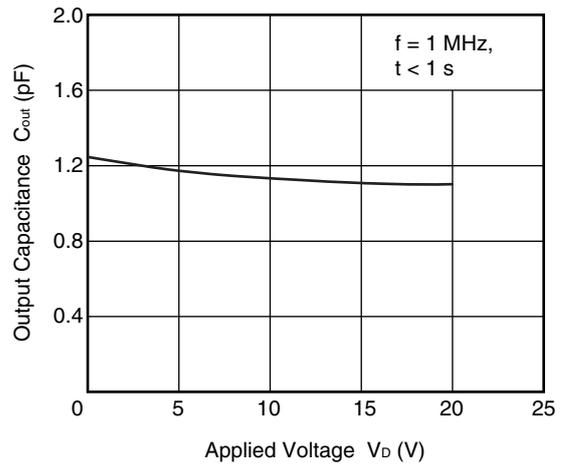
**MAXIMUM LOAD CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE**



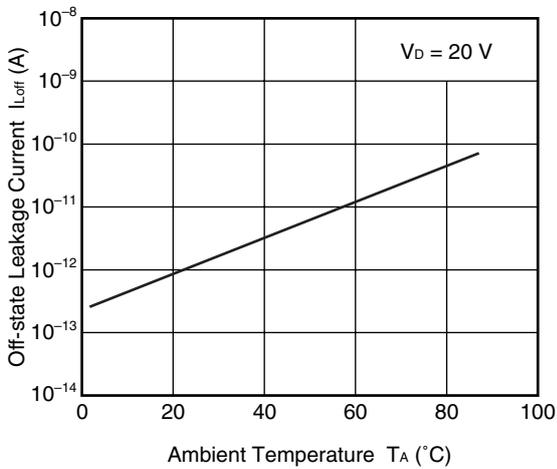
**FORWARD VOLTAGE vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE**



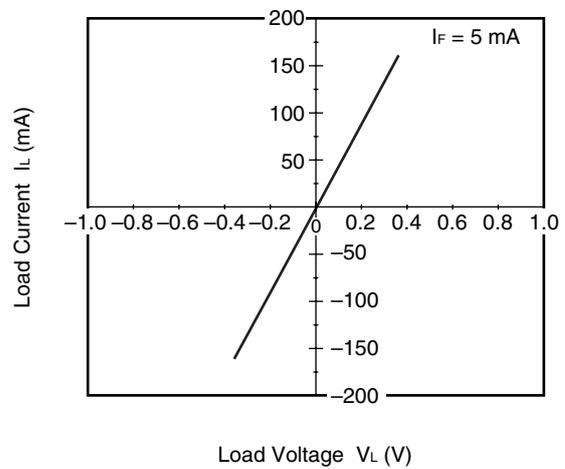
**OUTPUT CAPACITANCE vs. APPLIED VOLTAGE**



**OFF-STATE LEAKAGE CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE**

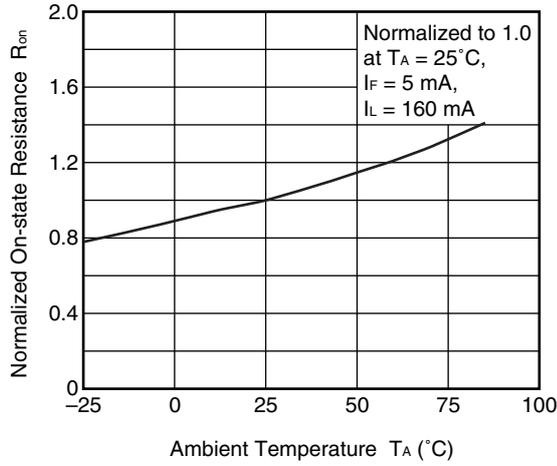


**LOAD CURRENT vs. LOAD VOLTAGE**

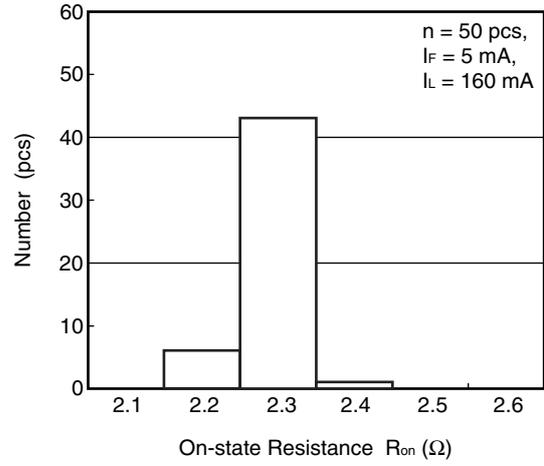

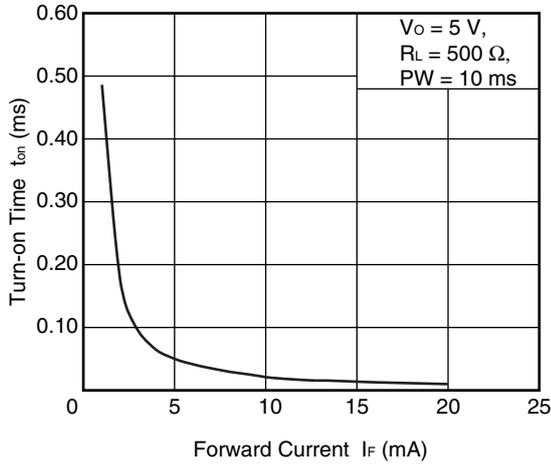
NORMALIZED ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE



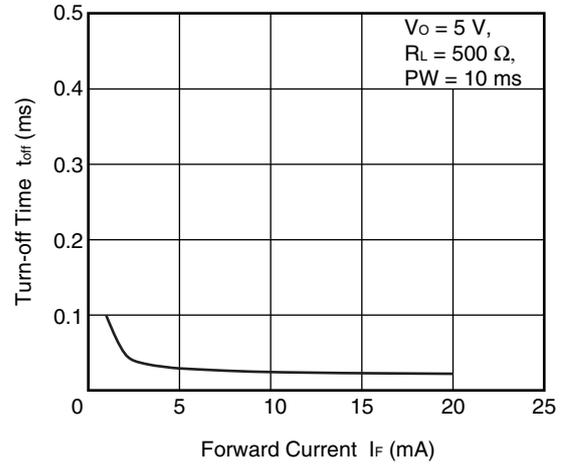
ON-STATE RESISTANCE DISTRIBUTION



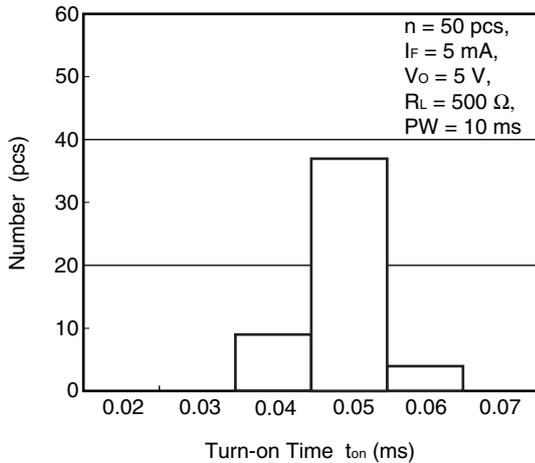
TURN-ON TIME vs. FORWARD CURRENT



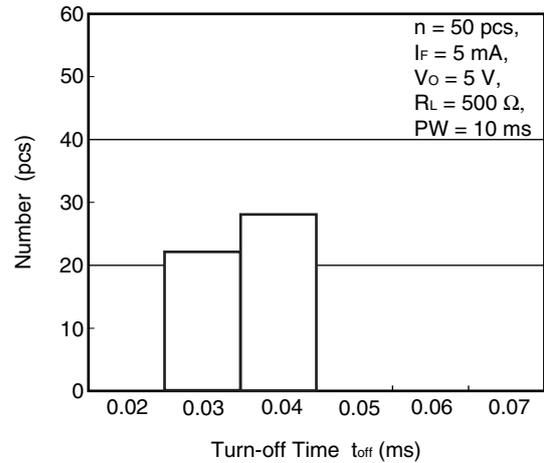
TURN-OFF TIME vs. FORWARD CURRENT



TURN-ON TIME DISTRIBUTION

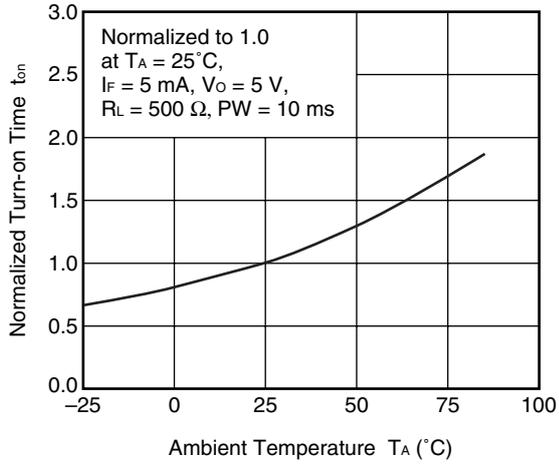


TURN-OFF TIME DISTRIBUTION

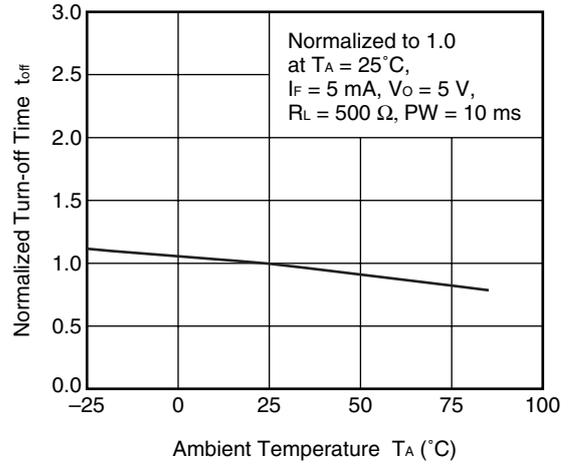

NORMALIZED TURN-ON TIME vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE



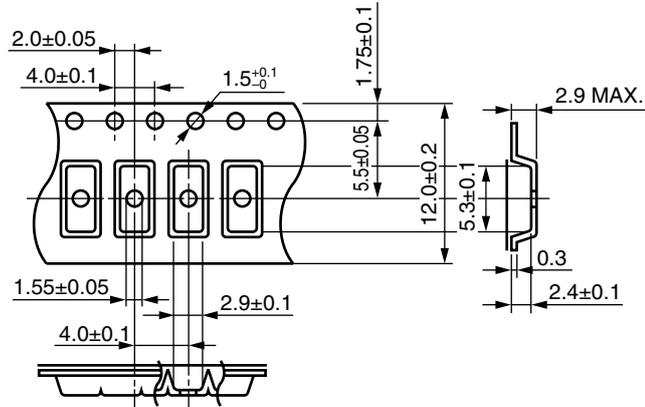
NORMALIZED TURN-OFF TIME vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE

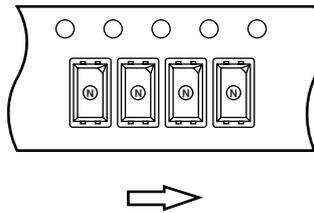

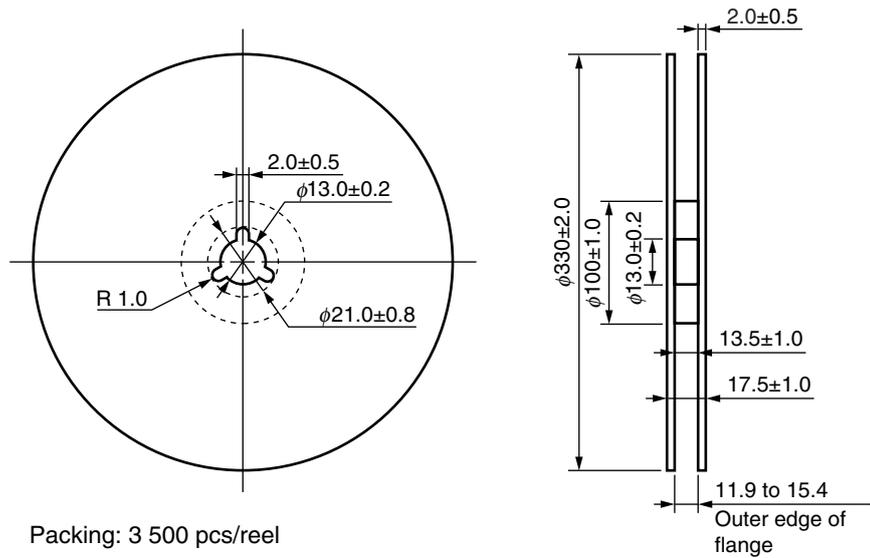


Tape Direction

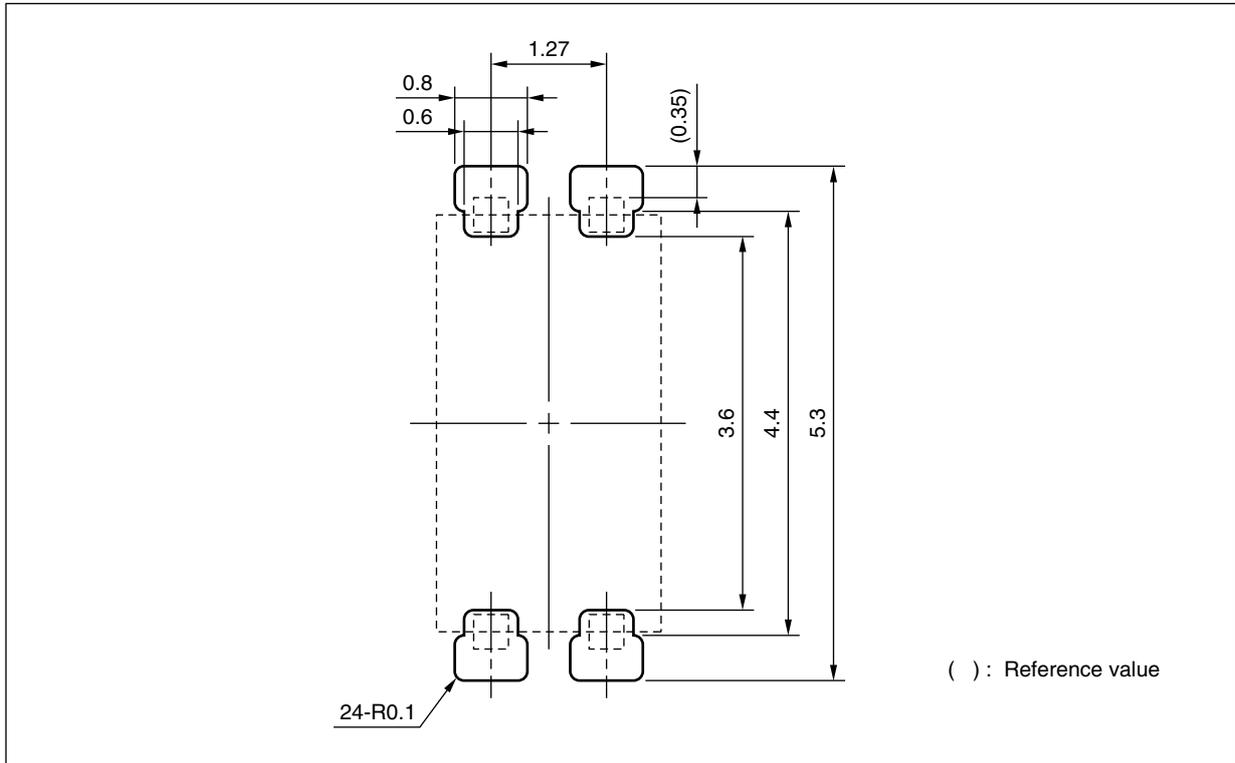


Outline and Dimensions (Reel)

RECOMMENDED MOUNT PAD DIMENSIONS (UNIT: mm)



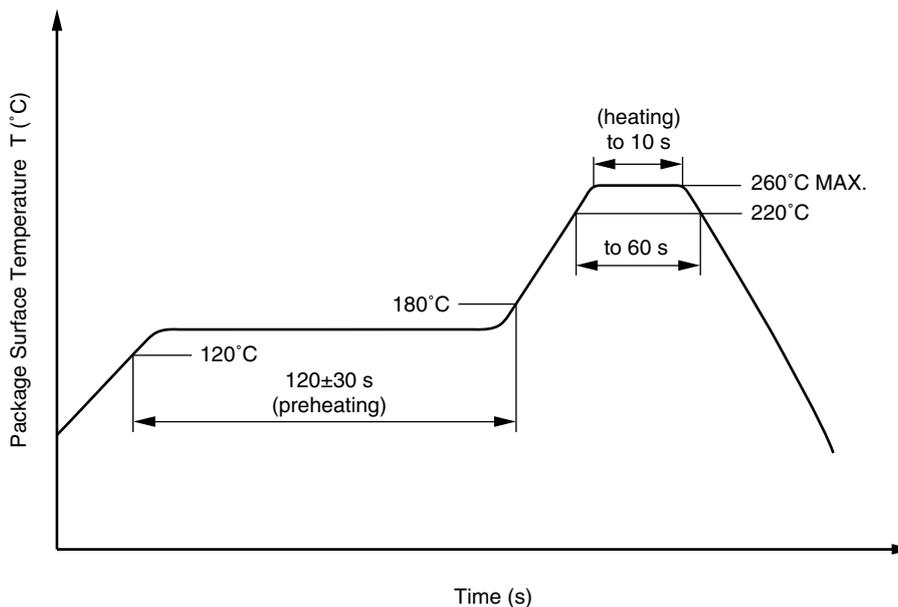

**RECOMMENDED SOLDERING CONDITIONS**

**(1) Infrared reflow soldering**

- Peak reflow temperature 260°C or below (package surface temperature)
- Time of peak reflow temperature 10 seconds or less
- Time of temperature higher than 220°C 60 seconds or less
- Time to preheat temperature from 120 to 180°C 120±30 s
- Number of reflows Three
- Flux Rosin flux containing small amount of chlorine (The flux with a maximum chlorine content of 0.2 Wt% is recommended.)

**(2) Wave soldering**

- Temperature 260°C or below (molten solder temperature)
- Time 10 seconds or less
- Preheating conditions 120°C or below (package surface temperature)
- Number of times One
- Flux Rosin flux containing small amount of chlorine (The flux with a maximum chlorine content of 0.2 Wt% is recommended.)

**(3) Soldering by soldering iron**

- Peak temperature (lead part temperature) 350°C or below
- Time (each pins) 3 seconds or less
- Flux Rosin flux containing small amount of chlorine (The flux with a maximum chlorine content of 0.2 Wt% is recommended.)

- (a) Soldering of leads should be made at the point 1.5 to 2.0 mm from the root of the lead.
- (b) Please be sure that the temperature of the package would not be heated over 100°C.

**(4) Cautions**

- Fluxes  
Avoid removing the residual flux with freon-based and chlorine-based cleaning solvent.
