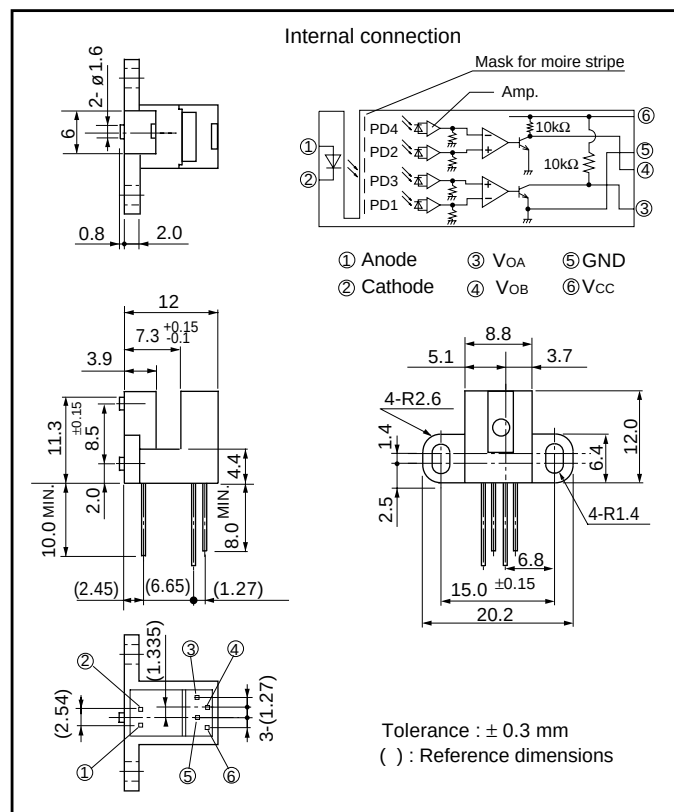

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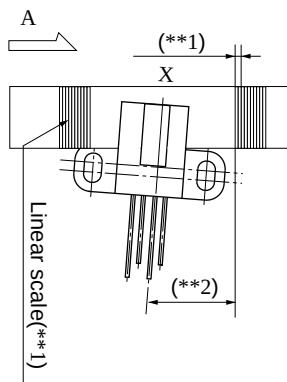

Fig.1 Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature

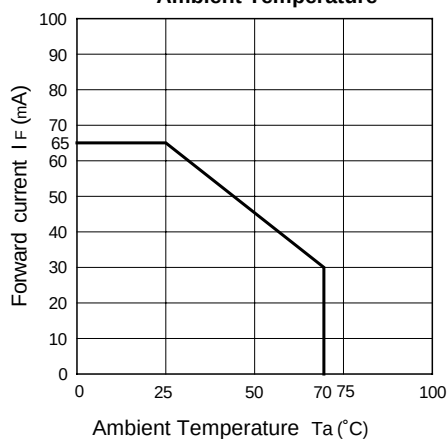
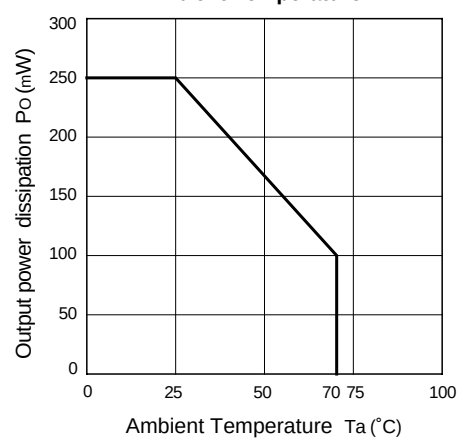


Fig.2 Output Power Dissipation vs. Ambient Temperature
