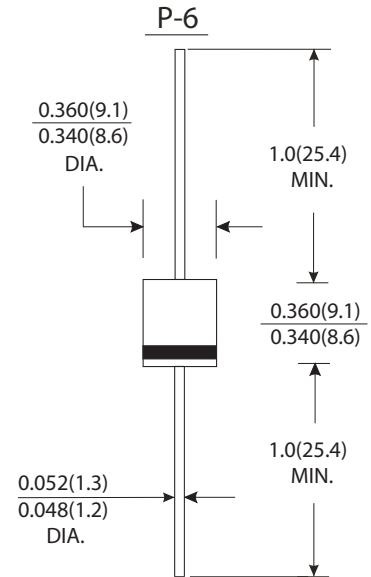

FIG.1-FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE

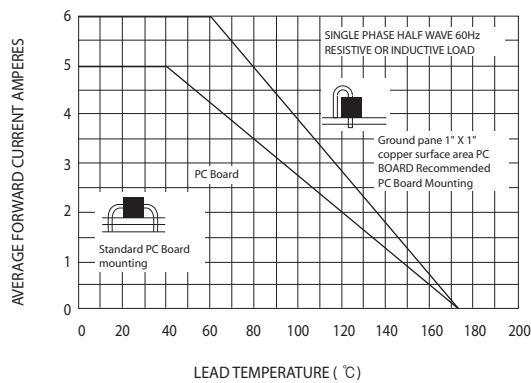


FIG.3-MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

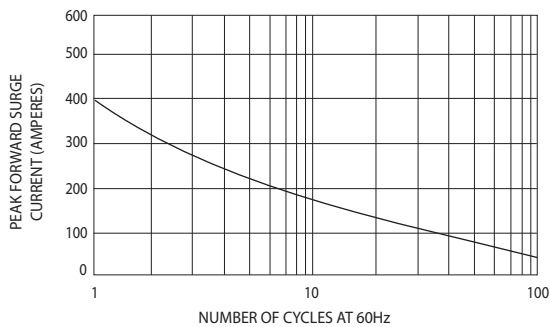


FIG.5-TYPICAL THERMAL RESISTANCE VS LEAD LENGTH

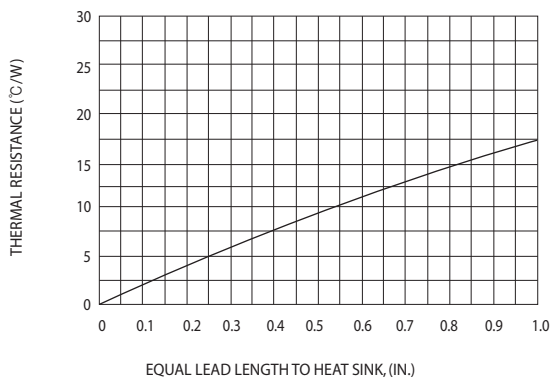


FIG.2-TYPICAL INSTANTANEOUS FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

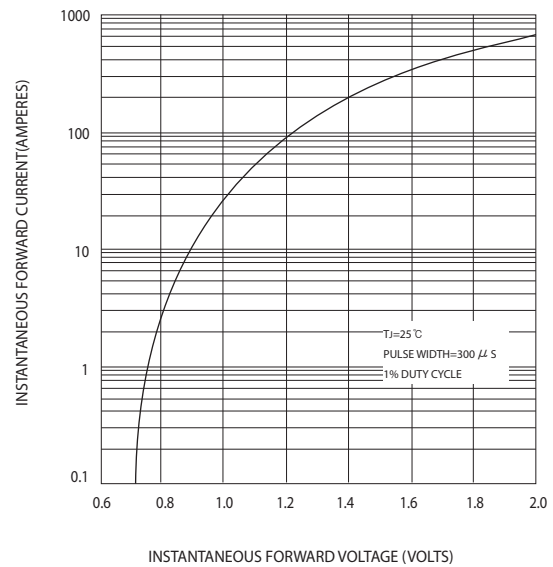


FIG.4-TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS
